

#### POW WOW STATISTICS

Attendance: 37 churches, 121 men, 44 A.S.T. Rangers, 153 Trail Blazers, 145 Pioneers, 55 Buck-A-Roos, 518 total. How does this compare with 1971 PowWow? 100% increase in churches attending and 80% increase in total attendance.

It was a tremendous blessing to see all the boys giving their hearts to the Lord at the Pow Wow. I estimate about 80 boys came to the alter call Thursday and Friday nights. It was a rewarding experience for me to have a small part in helping Rebel Klien (from Dayton OP 89) accept Jesus as his personal Praise God! Savior. Here is a report from our First Aid Station. (Operators Maj. Fitzgerald and Capt. Willmon) There were several accidents and the Houston Section First Aid vehicles were kept busy. We made three trips to Montgomery County Hospital in Conroe and 11 persons were treated in the camp area. We praise the Lord to report that all those injured were doing fine by April 18 and that nothing more serious happened.

We were very pleased to note that this Pow Wow had the highest percentage of men and boys in uniform than any before. (about 94%)


